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## CHAPTER ONE INTRODUCTION

#### 1.0 Background

The Assembly after a successful implementation of the projects in the DMTDP for three years has just ended the annual implementation of its programmes and projects for the year 2020. This document covers the annual implementation of the Municipal's third year activities, hence there is the need to update stakeholders on the state of implementation of the plan with regards to the Assembly's achievement, challenges and make suggestion for improvement.

The Annual Progress Report for the year 2020 provides a framework for the systematic review of outputs and outcomes of the implementation of the Municipal Annual Action Plan for 2020 and the DMTDP programmes and projects. The Report captures results from the assessment of a set of nationally recommended core indicators and district specific benchmarks. Specifically, it examines the achievement status of the following:

- Core municipal indicators;
- Other municipal indicators;
- Revenue performance;
- Expenditure performance; and
- Critical development and poverty issues.

#### 1.1 Purpose of monitoring and evaluation for the period January-December 2020

The rationale for Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) for the year 2020 was to ensure that the Assembly improved the availability, accessibility, reliability, timeliness and quality of public services to inhabitants to improve their social and economic wellbeing.

#### 1.1.1 The key monitoring and evaluation Objectives for the year 2020

The main objectives for M&E in the quarter under review were:

- to assess progress made towards the achievement of municipal development targets;
- to document the implementation processes of the Municipal Annual Action Plan (MAAP) for the year 2020 in the context of the MTDP for 2018-2021 to facilitate learning, reflection and improvement in future planning activities;
- to identify and address constraints and challenges that are likely to hinder the achievement of the goals and objectives of the MAAP for 2020 and eventually the MTDP 2018 2021; and
- to make recommendations for decision making and re-planning.

#### **1.2 Processes Involved and Difficulties Encountered**

The Progress Report was prepared with inputs from Departments and Agencies of the Assembly in the form of reports on programmes and projects implementation outputs and outcomes for the year under review as captured in the MAAP. That was complemented by reports from field inspections, monitoring and evaluation activities undertaken by the Municipal Planning Coordinating Unit (MPCU) and reports on the activities of other Development Partners.

Challenges encountered in the preparation of the Report included non-availability of targets and data for some of the Core Municipal Indicators which must be considered for revision. In addition, the availability of some data to the Assembly is dependent on some national agencies of those departments, which often affect the timely availability or otherwise of such data for reporting.

#### 1.3 Status of implementation of the District Medium Term Development Plan

A review of the status of implementation of programmes and projects in the DMTDP for 2018-2021 showed that the Assembly has implemented 97 percent of the planned programmes and projects. This achievement has been made possible through the contribution of development partners, non-governmental organizations and central government alongside effective collaboration from other development stakeholders in the provision of public services in the municipality. #### 1.4. Difficulties or challenges encountered in implementing, monitoring, and evaluation of the plan

A lot of challenges were encountered during the implementation of the projects, monitoring, and evaluation exercise. Some of these challenges included, delay in release of funds for the execution of projects as well as programmes, unwillingness of contractors to be present during the project monitoring visits when called upon hence making evaluation and recommendations difficult. In addition to the above, the municipality is not able to provide information on some programmes that are carried within the municipality but was awarded by the central government. This is specific for the critical development and poverty issues, most of the programmes are allocated and disbursed at the national level and therefore the regional or municipality are not able to provide the information requested of them. We suggest that some of these target and data for the Core municipal Indicators must be considered for revision.

Finally, the availability of some data to the Assembly is dependent on some national agencies of those departments, which often affect the timely availability or otherwise of such data for reporting.

## CHAPTER TWO MONITORING AND EVALUATION ACTIVITIES REPORT

#### **2.0 Introduction**

This section assesses the performance of the Assembly in realizing its specific development outputs. Other issues covered include sources of funding for development programmes and projects and their utilization, the level of core municipal development target achievements, poverty issues and evaluation of projects and programmes implemented.

#### 2.1 Status of implementation of 2020 Annual Action Plan

An assessment of the status of implementation of programmes and projects in the Annual Action Plan for 2020 is important in knowing which Development Dimension the Assembly did well. It also enables management to take corrective measures to improve performance. The Assembly in the year 2020 continued to implement 97 percent of the projects and programmes (112) captured in the DAAP. The Assembly's performance in Environmental, Infrastructure and Human Settlement is high compared with the other Development Dimensions. Table 2.1 gives analysis of the performance.

## CHAPTER THREE THE WAY FORWARD

#### 3.0 Key issues addressed and those yet to be addressed

Most of the matters were addressed and those that were not communicated were due to conditions and situations beyond the control of the Assembly. The major provocation for the period under the review was undue delay in the release of funds to some departments such as Department of Agriculture, Social Welfare and Community Development, Physical Planning and Works (Feeder Roads Unit). This significantly affected the implementation of their outline programmes and projects. The affected Departments were exacted to re-strategize to enable them tackle critical programmes that required limited financial resources while the Assembly also provided some managerial support and funding to facilitate their activities.

#### **3.1 Recommendations**

Refresher training in results-based project management, monitoring and evaluation will still be required by key staff of Departments of the Assembly to increase their skills to effectively implement, monitor and evaluate programmes and projects with available resources.

The Assembly will need to increase its financial support to its departments to enable them contribute effectively to the district.

The MPCU should discuss effective ways of providing baseline indicators for core district indicators and all other programmes and projects.

There is the need for some of the core district indicators to be reviewed to make them relevant to the district and to enhance easy collection of data in order to measure performance.
